A NOTE FROM AUGUSTINE PAYNE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

June 24th was the two-year anniversary of the Dobbs vs. Jackson decision that marked the end of the egregiously erroneous decision, Roe v. Wade. Roe is no longer the law of the land, but it is now our responsibility to work towards diminishing its continued tragic effect of causing the death of many human beings.

This month, I would like to highlight three things that includes a recent study to consider as we seek to make abortion unthinkable.

Since the overturn, we have states that are taking a stand and passing protections for preborn human beings, while at the same time they are also taking measures to provide more support for pregnant and parenting moms. The Ethics and Public Policy Center published a report called Two Years After Dobbs. In that report, they focus on the twenty-one states that have protections that would not have been permitted prior to the Dobbs decision, as well as they include Iowa and Ohio because of recent news in those respective states. 22 of the 23 states have increased Medicaid coverage for eligible moms postpartum from 60 days to one year. Fourteen of those states introduced or expanded programs that provided material assistance directly to moms in need, or they directed that assistance to pregnancy resource centers to provide the support. An example of that happening would be the Iowa MOMS bill. Some of the states have increased the limits on eligibility for “safety net services.” The future is pro-life, and it will include providing more support to moms and families in need. There are states that prove it. You can read and learn more about the report at www.eppc.org/publication/two-years-after-dobbs/.

How have the last two years been for Dubuque County Right To Life? Our goal has been to increase our outreach efforts in order to change more hearts and minds on the issue of abortion. One way we do that currently, is to be out in the community discussing people's personal beliefs on the issue. We are utilizing the tools for good and effective dialogue learned through the Equipped for Life Course as well as the Justice For All presentation, Abortion: from Debate to Dialogue. I highly encourage you to attend a Justice for All presentation on July 10 or July 11. You can learn more about the seminar on page 6. People learn a lot during these seminars, and it takes work, but it is worth it as we seek to make abortion unthinkable in our area.

The pro-life movement has suffered many losses at the ballot box since the Dobbs decision, so we must always be asking ourselves whether we are using the most effective means to change hearts and minds on abortion, so we can save more children from a gruesome death.

Earlier this year, Protect Life Michigan published a study they conducted on the effectiveness of using abortion victim images to change hearts and minds. Abortion victim images are images of children who have been killed by an abortion and whose bodies have been discovered in a dumpster or in a box on their way to be burned for energy (Google Justice for the Five to learn more about the latter). People have taken pictures because, like tragedies of the past, who would believe that human beings were capable of such awful acts against other human beings? Protect Life Michigan found that the images of the victims are more likely to change people's perspective on abortion (49%), than a pro-life statement without an image (31%). There is more in the study than just this one statistic. I encourage you to check it out and let me know your thoughts. PRO-LIFE COURT & LEGISLATION UPDATE

Dear friends for Life,

Here's some court and legislative news from Iowa and around the nation.

IOWA

By the time you read this newsletter, we expect to have a decision from the Supreme Court of Iowa on Iowa's so – called heartbeat law, the details of which were set out in my May and June columns. You will recall that the legislature had to pass the law twice in order to have the Supreme Court review it, and there is no way to predict if it will be upheld or not. You will receive an email blast from the DCRTL office when the court's ruling is issued.

NATIONAL NEWS

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled on the abortion pill, Mifepristone, but in a way that did not address the merits of the case. You will recall that a group of Pro-Life doctors challenged the legalization of the abortion pills, arguing that for decades the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) "has stripped away every meaningful and necessary safeguard on chemical abortion, demonstrating callous disregard for women's well-being, unborn life, and statutory limits." The Pro-Life doctors were successful in a federal court in Texas, but that case and a contrary ruling in a separate federal court went to the Supreme Court. The appeal to the Supreme Court was filed by the drug maker (Danco), which is making millions of dollars off of the drug and the pro-abortion attorneys of the Biden administration.

The Supreme Court ruled unanimously that the doctors lacked the required direct stake in the dispute, which they needed to challenge the FDA's approval of the pill, mifepristone. Having a stake in the case is called "standing."

"The plaintiffs do not prescribe or use mifepristone," Justice Kavanaugh wrote. "And the F.D.A. is not requiring them to do or refrain from doing anything."

In other words, they failed because they don't prescribe the deadly abortion drugs. However, the case can be revived through three Republican-led states, Idaho, Kansas, and Missouri, which have intervened as plaintiffs at the lower court level. Hopefully, Iowa will join any such suit. The Court would probably rule that the states do have standing as entities that want to legitimately stop abortion in their states.

In the meantime, the abortion pills remain legal in any state where abortion is legal under state law...which currently includes Iowa. For example, the Emma Goldman abortion killing center in Iowa City passes out the pills up to and even beyond 9 weeks of pregnancy.

Stay tuned, as we have not heard the last of this matter. Pro-Life lawyers and doctors never quit.

In more national news, the U.S. House of Representatives on June 13, 2024, approved an amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act to stop the Biden Administration from funding or reimbursing service members for costs associated with abortions. It garnered support from a majority of Republicans but faced opposition from most Democrats, resulting in a vote of 214-207. This amendment stops the Pentagon policy of funding abortions for members of the armed services who travel to pro-abortion states to kill their unborn child.

VA clinics across the country should be providing medical services to veterans. Instead, Joe Biden is turning them into abortion centers.

The bill is unlikely to pass the Senate.

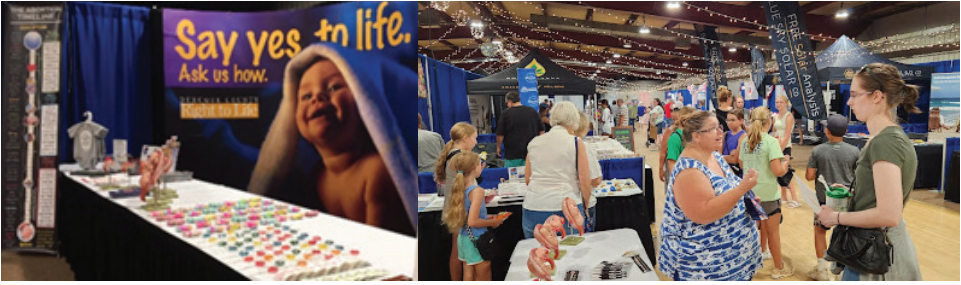

NEWS FROM OTHER STATES

New York - The highest appellate court in New York has ruled that non-profit employers' health insurance plans must cover "medically necessary" abortions, unless they have a primary purpose of "inculcation of religious values" AND employ people who share the organization's religious beliefs. In other words, any Catholic employer who employs workers of other faiths or no faith must pay for abortions under their employee health plans. Also, any non-profit that might have other good intentions (serving the homeless or helping immigrants) but without any religious purpose would also have to finance baby killing. This is government coercion for killing babies. Fortunately, the Diocese of Albany and others have vowed to appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court.

In other New York news, the Thomas More Society won a court victory against New York Attorney General Letitia James who was suing New York pregnancy resource centers alleging that they mislead the public. A judge ruled that the case should be tried in Rochester, New York, not Manhattan. This is important because potential jurors in Rochester, New York, would arguably be more open minded about Pro-Life efforts than Manhattan jurors would be, thus ensuring a fairer trial.

Illinois - The House of Representatives in Illinois has passed House Bill 581, which states that abortion is to be considered a "stabilizing treatment" for pregnant women who go to a hospital emergency room, even if the mother's life is not in danger. All that would be necessary is that the woman may suffer a "serious illness" if she does not have an abortion. Hospitals would be fined a minimum of \$50,000 if any of their ER doctors refuse to abort a child in that circumstance. This bill was pushed to passage by Illinois Democrats in the House over the objection of every single Pro-Life Republican. The pro-aborts are worried that a ruling coming in June from the U.S. Supreme Court in an Idaho case would allow Idaho emergency room doctors to refuse to perform abortions. If the June ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court upholds a doctor's right in Idaho to refuse to perform abortions in the ER, this new Illinois state law will take over and force Illinois ER doctors to kill babies because such would be considered in Illinois to be a necessary and required "stabilizing treatment." (Because you will be reading this column in July, please look in the news to see what the Supreme Court did in the Idaho case.)

Tennessee and Delaware - these states have approved Pro-Life laws to help newborn babies and infants. Tennessee will now cover through its Medicaid program the cost of up to 100 diapers per month for eligible moms with children aged 2 or under. Delaware Medicaid-eligible moms will receive up to 80 diapers and up to one pack of baby wipes per week for the first 12 weeks after their baby is born.

That's all for now, friends. I know there will be lots to report next time. Be sure to scour the news and internet for stories on the matters set out above. DCRTL will keep you informed as you spread the word on the humanity of the preborn, the positive Pro-Life alternatives to abortion, and how we are all helping women facing unintended pregnancies.
